#### IN MEMORIAM

**Dr. Kanaiyalal M Munshi**

**30.12.1887 - 08.02.1971**

**(BG 371 March 1971)**

**Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India,  
Founder president of our Corps**

Shri Munshi served nation in various fields -legal, political and educational. He became the Home Minister of Bombay in 1937 and was appointed in 1947 as Agent-General of the Government of India in Hyderabad. He joined the Union Cabinet as Food Minister in 1950 and was the Governor of Uttar Pradesh from 1952 to 1957. He founded the Bhartiya Vidyā Bhavan in 1938 and nurtured it into an all-India cultural and educational organization which today in standing monument to his versatile abilities as a renaissance man.

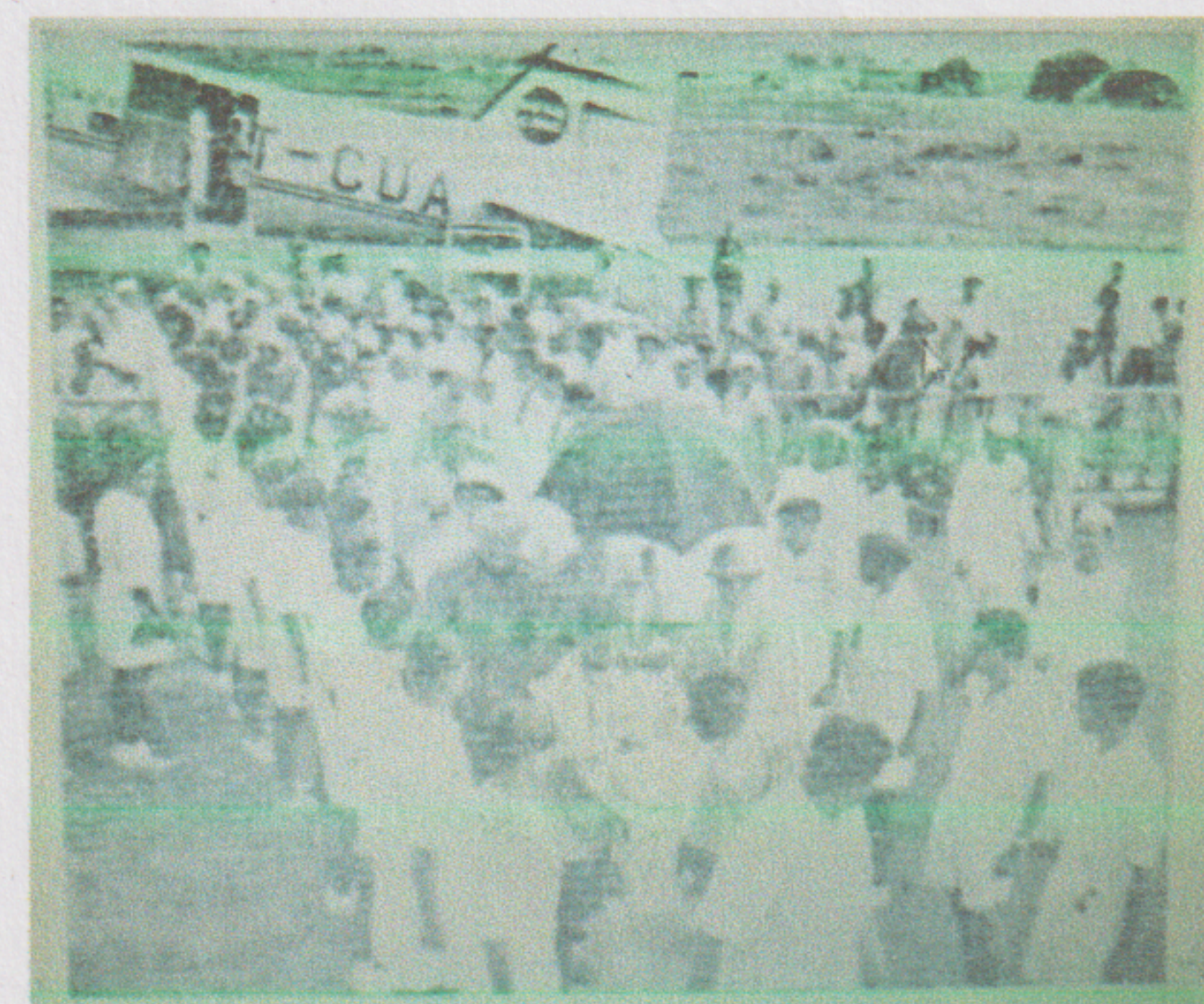
Shri Munshi was one of the founder members of the Society. For over 41 years he served the Society as its President, and took keen interest in the work and progress of the Corps.

#### Special Removal Service

(From BG 117 - October 1948)

Shri Kanaiyalal M. Munshi, India's Agent-General in Hyderabad and President of our Society, who arrived in Bombay by air from Secunrabad on 23rd September, 1948, was removed in the Society's Ambulance Car No. 3 from Santacruz Airport to his residence at Malabar Hill (Removal Service No. 17163). No. sooner Shri Munshi's special plane landed at the airfield at 13-55 hours, the Officer Commanding approached the distinguished President of the Corps, enquired of his health and congratulated him on behalf of the Corps on his successful mission in Hyderabad. Ag.2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. Dharamdas I. Bhansali, L.S.E., Dip. Amb. Work, was in charge of the Removal Service squad, while Ag. Capt. Nilanjana B. Mehta, Dip. Amb. Work, supervised the arrangements.
