In him we have lost a social worker, friend, Philosopher, Guide and Educationist.

In November 2006 Dr. Suresh D Mehtalia, was elected as the president of the Society in place of late Dr. VH. Salaskar.

He was an eminent diabetologist of the city of Mumbai. He was an honorary diabetologist of Sir H.N. Hospital, Sir Kikabhai Hospital, Asian heart Institute and Governor of Maharashtra. PART II

HERNIA

A hernia (rupture) is a protrusion of parts of the abdominal contents (often a small loop of intestine) through a weak part of the muscular wall. It may result from coughing or heavy exertion. The swelling may disappear if the casualty lies down. If it is painful, and especially if it occurs with vomiting and abdominal pain, the hernia is "strangulated" and needs urgent surgical attention.

Recognition

- Bulge or swelling in abdominal wall.
- Pain in abdomen or groin.
- Vomiting.

TREATMENT

YOUR AIMS ARE:

To reassure the casualty and relieve discomfort.

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To obtain medical aid.

FOR A PAINLESS HERNIA

Reassure the casualty. Without causing him or her needless alarm tell the casualty to arrange to see his or her own doctor about the condition as soon as possible. **DO NOT** attempt to push in the swelling or allow the casualty to do so.

FOR A PAINFUL HERNIA

- 1. Support the casualty in the position he finds most comfortable, by propping him up with cushions or pillows.
- 2. Call a doctor, or if the pain is severe, DIAL FOR AN AMBULANCE.

VOMITING AND DIARRHOEA

The causes of vomiting and diarrhea are most likely to be food poisoning, contaminated water, allergies, or unusual or exotic foods. Vomiting may, of course, occur without diarrhea, and vice versa. When both occur together there is an increased risk of dehydration, especially in infants, young children, and the elderly, which can be serious.

TREATMENT

YOUR AIM IS:

- To restore lost fluid and salts.
- Reassure the casualty while he or she is sick. Afterwards, give the casualty a warm damp cloth with which to wash him - or herself.
- Give the casualty lots of bland fluids to sip slowly and often. If the appetite returns, give him only bland, starchy, or sugary food for the first 24 hours.

If you are worried about the casualty's condition, particularly if it is persistent, call a doctor.

SUITABLE DRINKS

Water is sufficient in most cases, but still "isotonic" glucose drinks are ideal, if available. Alternatively, add salt (1 teaspoonful per litre) and sugar (4 or 5 teaspoonful per litre) to either water or diluted orange juice, which is a useful source of potassium.

VERTIGO

A disturbance in the ear canal can cause an abnormal sensation of movement: the casualty feels as if he or she is revolving in space and feels "giddy." This is vertigo, a common complaint that often starts in middle age. It has many causes, including temporary conditions, such as ear infections, and psychological disorders, such as fear of open spaces (agoraphobia). Very occasionally, vertigo indicates a more serious condition, such as hardening of the arteries (atherosclerosis), Meniere's disease (an inner ear disorder) or multiple sclerosis.

TREATMENT

YOUR AIMS ARE:

- To relieve pain.
- To obtain medical aid if necessary.
- Place the casualty in a comfortable position and note any change in his or her condition.
- 2. If the casualty has special medication prescribed for this condition, he or she may need help to take it.
- Call a doctor if the casualty is very distressed or requests medical help.
 Stay with the casualty until the doctor arrives, noting any changes in the casualty's condition in the meantime.

AN APPEAL FOR DONATION
